
100 Not Out! Northern Caribbean University Aims for Greater Heights

President of Northern Caribbean University Dr. Lincoln Edwards has highlighted the alignment of the century-old multidisciplinary institution with the practical demands of a modern, developing Jamaican society.

In asserting NCU's position pertaining to national development, Edwards spoke of its involvement in product research and commercialization, among other accomplishments in national and international spheres. He was delivering the keynote address at a ceremony during which the university recognized the support of members of Manchester's business, civic and academic communities, as the institution closed its 100th anniversary celebrations in mid-January at its main campus in Mandeville.



Dubbed the NCU Community Partner Recognition Awards, the university's top brass presented 100 commemorative plaques, symbolizing the institution's centennial, to some 50 representatives of public and private sector organizations, including the **Jamaica Observer**.

Edwards, in his wide-ranging address, described a multifaceted learning and research university that offers education and training in diverse vocational and academic disciplines, ranging from a school of nursing to the fine arts. He championed the Seventh-day Adventist-administered institution's work in scientific research, academia, sports, and in international competitions in digital technology, and declared that *"more is yet to come"*. Edwards identified the commercialization of products which NCU played leading roles in developing. These include the NCU's own Zon Teasan, a cinnamon-ginger nutri-tea brand launched last year in association with Zon International Holdings, a US-based company.

Zon Teasan, described as a nutraceutical product, was developed by the university's researchers and is an extract from a strain of a cinnamon-ginger plant developed by the Bog Walk, St Catherine, farmer Errol McGhie.

Edwards also lauded the research work of NCU's Professor Paul Gyles in developing the commercial potential of sorrel as a beverage, now on the market. Research has shown that both cinnamon-ginger and sorrel contain anti-cancer agents. Emphasizing the need for mass education at the tertiary level the NCU president argued that, *"We have moved from the era in which universities were principally concerned with educating an elite group of young people and conducting research based on the interest of the academics"*.

Society and governments are now expecting more from universities...as governments look increasingly to higher education to help their communities become economically and socially successful in a global economy."

NCU's achievements locally and internationally over the last decade include being the first and only institution from the Caribbean to win two major international competitions - namely the World Microsoft Imagine Cup Software Competition (2010, Poland) and the International Business Model Competition (Utah, 2018).

In sport, NCU has excelled in badminton, netball, basketball and football - last year dominating the intercollegiate level of badminton, netball and football to become reigning champions in each. NCU also copped the Prime Minister's Award for Innovation last year and have also been National Student Debate champions.


On show at the ceremony, emceed by NCU executives Arnold Kelly and Nadeen Campbell, were other facets of the institution's versatility.

These took the form of performances from the university's music department, with the evening's musical offering ranging from violinist Arieski Garcia's rendition of Bach's *Aria*, accompanied on piano by Dr Diana Wilson, head of the music department; former student Earlon Cornwall on soprano saxophone with a religious number *God and God Alone*; and a scintillating delivery by student Erica Lumsden of *God Bless NCU*, sang to the tune of Whitney Houston's Grammy-Award winning cover version of Dolly Parton's *I Will Always Love You*.

The words of *God Bless NCU* were penned by veteran Adventist pastor Derek Bignall.

MEDICAL STUDENTS SAY UWI TORONTO GALA SCHOLARSHIPS LIFELINE TO DREAMS

Medical faculty students Clifton Thompson and Natasha St Cyr are completing their degrees at The University of the West Indies (UWI), Mona, with assistance from UWI Toronto Gala Scholarship program.

Thompson is studying clinical medicine, the program cost of which is US\$28,000, but with subsidies the cost to the student is approximately US\$5,000 annually. St Cyr, meanwhile, is pursuing the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program which costs US\$10,000 each year. St Cyr, now a fourth-year student, says her plans are to specialize in oncology or become a consultant pharmacist. This dream, she says, has been made possible by the CDN\$3,000-a-year scholarship from the annual UWI Toronto Gala which raises funds for students in need. Scotiabank, which has been the lead sponsor for its scholarship program over the last 10 years, making awards to 500 students in that time, has committed to continuing its support for another five years, increasing the amount of its assistance to CDN\$75,000 annually, including 15 new Scotiabank scholarships. These will benefit students such as Thompson and St Cyr.

“Pharmacy is a dynamic field with many areas you can go into. There is also a lot of room for improvement in the Caribbean in terms of catching up with first world countries,” St Cyr says, explaining her choice of program.

Her mother, a single mom with four children, was challenged to assist, although employed as a nurse. But hope was born when St Cyr met Beverley Hunter, The UWI scholarship program coordinator, who she said, “encouraged me and with her help my grades improved”.

Since her second year, St Cyr has been able to combine scholarship funds from various sources with loans and has been better able to cope. The 22-year-old says the UWI Toronto Gala Scholarship has been a great source of relief, allowing her to give full attention to studies and also be relaxed enough to participate in extracurricular activities. St Cyr is the founder of the Pharmacy Students Association and served as the organization’s first president. She is scheduled to graduate in 2021.

As for Thompson, “This scholarship is helping me to achieve my goals and so far, it has helped with my studies tremendously, as it has eased some of the financial constraints that are there. I’ve always wanted to study medicine, but due to the high cost and being from a poor background I gave up on that dream and passion. When I was awarded this scholarship, the passion was once again rekindled. I really needed the scholarship to assist me with my tuition fees as it is very costly,” he revealed.



Thompson has nine siblings (2 brothers and 7 sisters) and both his parents are unemployed.

“My parents parted from I was young [about nine years old] and I stayed with my father,” he disclosed. “My father got sick [and is still sick] from the time I was attending primary school and so I was the one who had to cook and take care of things along with my older brother.”

The challenge of paying for school affected his entire family. He outlines that of his seven sisters, two are attending university, while one recently completed training at that level. One sibling is still in high school and two are working as teachers. Thompson is optimistic about a future which has been made possible by the Toronto Gala and other scholarship support.

“In terms of my future career, I’m planning on becoming a cardiothoracic surgeon or a general surgeon, if it is God’s will.” His advice to those who are also struggling to pay for the education needed for their dream career is to also be optimistic and prayerful.



UWI Chancellor Matches Prime Minister's Donation to Mona Students

KINGSTON, Jamaica. Thirty-four students studying at the University of the West Indies (UWI) Mona Campus benefited from a donation by the University's Chancellor, Robert Bermudez, during the last examination period in December

2019. The Chancellor's donation, which matched that of the Prime Minister Andrew Holness, increased the pool of funds available for students in need of financial support.

According to a statement from UWI, Bermudez officially presented the Mona Campus with his donation of \$1.5 million at a ceremony today; however, the funds were received by the Campus on December 5, last year, to facilitate examinations. The university said that 33 Jamaicans and one Trinidadian benefitted from the donation. It added that four of the Jamaican students currently study at The UWI Western Jamaica Campus.

The Chancellor explained that the donation was a grant to the university which was intended to support students who were at risk of being de-registered. He further indicated that the donation to Mona specifically was due to the unique challenge of students facing de-registration as a result of non-payment of tuition fees, noting that other students of the UWI are fully sponsored by their respective governments.

According to Bermudez, *"one of the things we know too well, particularly in the West Indies...the reality is we*

have brilliant people who come from every circumstance in life ...therefore those of us who have been successful in life really owe our debt to those who are coming after us." This, he said, will ensure that *"as many of them as possible can maximize their talent by getting themselves a tertiary education if they decide that that is what they need."*

Meanwhile, Campus Principal Professor Dale Webber described the assistance as substantial. *"For us it was a substantial contribution, not just in terms of dollar value; the fact that it came in the middle of the examination season gave us the opportunity to assist students. The funds were directed specifically toward students who were about to complete their studies, needed one or two more courses, just to get through that door of opportunity,"* Professor Webber said.

President of the Guild of Students, Christina Williams, added that the fact that it is coming from the Chancellor's personal funds that made the contribution even more meaningful. *"We hope this will be an inspiration to others to contribute as well. I think if everyone including Alumni and other stakeholders would contribute, young people would be even more empowered to go out and seize opportunities, to make a real difference, not just in our school, but in our country, in the Caribbean, and in our world,"* she said.


